### HOW TO FILE AN APPLICATION FOR PARTICIPATING IN THE SOCIAL ACADEMY

The application is required to

- be written in English
- be addressed to the Social Institute Kommende Dortmund
- be dated and signed by the applicant
- include a certificate of termination of the 3rd year of major seminary
- include the bishop's or seminary rector's approval
- be sent till **March 1st, 2026** by mail.

### FINAL ACCEPTANCE

**Participation restriction:** 25 attendees (in order of registration)

Once the application for access has been approved, the candidate will receive the confirmation by the Social Institute, which includes also a scholarship covering the accommodation and 50% of travel costs to Ružomberok and from Paderborn. The travel costs *within* the Social Academy are covered *in full* by the Social Institute Kommende Dortmund.

# GIVING EUROPE A SOUL

Rome, August 3, 2025. The Pope Leo Catholic youth gathering has brought together a vast crowd at Tor Vergata on the outskirts of Rome during the Holy Year, where the pontiff has urged young people to seek justice, serve the poor, and help build a more humane world. The event forms part of the Catholic Holy Year celebrations and marks the most attended event so far under the current papacy.

The election of Pope Leo XIV marked the beginning of a new chapter in the history of the Church. Pope Leo is the first missionary to become the successor of St. Peter, and right at the beginning of his pontificate, he programmatically expressed his mission and invitation: "I would like this to be our first great desire: a united Church, as a sign of unity and communion, which will become the leaven of a reconciled world." A plea for a Church in which all are called to "build up the house of God in fraternal communion, in harmony with the Holy Spirit and in a life of diversity."

One year after his inauguration, the special emphases of his pontificate are becoming apparent, and the question arises as to whether and how the goals of the universal Church can be implemented in practice in the local churches.



The Social Academy is once again under the proven leadership of Prelate Dr. Peter Klasvogt, long-time rector of the Paderborn Seminary and the Kommende Dortmund Social Institute, now rector of the Pontifical College of Priests at Campo Santo Teutonico in Rome. I warmly invite seminarians from Eastern and Western Europe to join me in experiencing a diverse and united missionary Church.

## SOCIAL ACADEMY FOR SEMINARIANS

Since 2007 about 350 seminarians from 16 countries participated successfully in the Social Academy, promoted by the Social Institute of the archdiocese and accredited by the Theological Faculty of Paderborn. The international summer school is a highly demanded formation program for upcoming priests, which imparts the knowledge of the Catholic Social Teaching combined with best practice examples and projects of Church institutions and social organizations, imbedded in an atmosphere of confidence and fraternity. This year the program includes participation in the European Youth Festival in Ružomberok and will be continued at the Spiritual Centre "Maria Immaculata" in Paderborn.

Transmitting the Catholic Social Teaching into action, former participants developed in their local communities the youth movement "socioMovens. Giving Europe a soul", working on local social problems and practical solutions to target social and spiritual poverty.
